Post-16 Options Assemblies	A series of assemblies for students designed to introduce the post-16 options process, including an overview of the different routes available, as well as more detailed guidance on both A Levels and vocational pathways, such as BTECs, T Levels and apprenticeships. One of the assemblies will be delivered by a member of the outreach team from Kingston College	April
Careers Guidance Interviews	All students will have an individual careers guidance interview with a trained careers adviser, either in the final term of Y10 or the first term of Y11. The purpose of this is to provide students with impartial information, advice and guidance on their post-16 options. Each appointment will last for approximately 45 minutes and a bespoke action plan will be created and shared with both students and parents / carers	Ongoing
Post-16 Options Evening	An evening event for parents / carers to introduce the post-16 options process, including an overview of the different routes available, as well as more detailed guidance on both A Levels and vocational pathways, such as BTECs, T Levels and apprenticeships. The event will be delivered in conjunction with a member of the outreach team at Kingston College	April
Work Experience	A week where all students spend five days in a professional workplace, developing transferable skills and building experience of the professional environment	July
Sixth Form Showcase	An event where students are given the opportunity to explore Waldegrave Sixth	July

Finance PDC Sessions	A series of sessions delivered via timetabled PDC lessons on the theme of finance, incorporating topics such as tax, insurance and student loans	July
